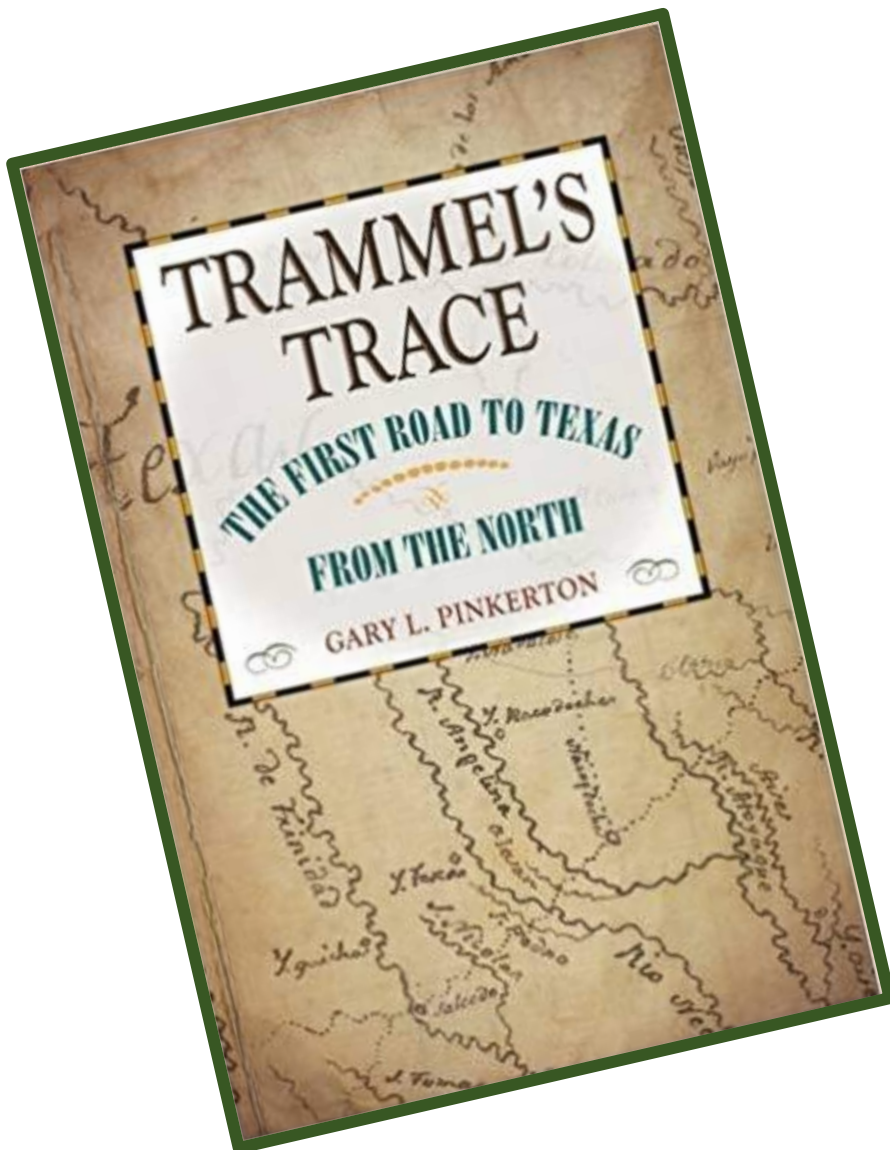

Gary Pinkerton began his quest over ten years ago culminating with publication of his book in 2016.

Trammel's Trace, named for Nicholas Trammell, was an early road into Texas. It was a 180 mile-trail that was used for migration from the United States into Texas before it became a republic. Many early settlers used it as their migration route especially settlers from Arkansas, Missouri, and Tennessee. Beginning in Arkansas, it crossed the Red River and then turned south to Nacogdoches. By the early nineteenth century, Trammel's Trace was largely a smuggler's trail that delivered horses and contraband into the region. Familiar names such as Sam Houston, David Crockett, and James Bowie joined throngs of immigrants making passage along Trammel's Trace.
