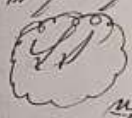

I Abraham Peterson of the County and
State aforesaid do hereby Certify that I sold to Mrs Elizabeth
Wheeler (then a citizen of the County and State aforesaid; but now
of Hopkins County Texas) some time in the fall of the year 1828
some Negroes to wit: Jude then aged about 36 years William
aged about 10 years Lucy about 4 years old & Fanny about
one year old the precise amount for which I sold said
Negroes I do not now recollect but think it was nine hundred
Dollars and that I then executed My bill of sale for
said Negroes to the said Mrs Elizabeth Wheeler

 sold & conveyed unto the said party of the second part William
 J. Blythe as aforesaid all of his right title interest claim
 or Demand whatsoever of in and to a certain Estate (containing
 the Estate of Herbold Blackman late of said County of Hopkins
 and State of Texas which the said party of the first part
 as aforesaid hath in said Estate for and in consideration of
 three hundred dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknow-
 ledged, the said party of the first part Alfred M. Short
 party of the first part as aforesaid doth warrant and defend
 unto the said party of the second part William J. Blythe as
 aforesaid the title to said Estate and portion of property
