 of Cassa aged twelve years and subject to have and to hold
 the same to their own proper use to be used as a slave
 after my death with my hand and seal using a seal

 she is a slave for life given under my hand and seal a bond

 foregoing bill of sale of Negro Girl from Henry Russell to S.H. Green

 the parties and that Henry Russell whose name appears to the same
 signed sealed and delivered said bill of sale for the consideration
 was and purposes therein contained and executed
