 Know all men by these presents that I Michael
 Mauney for and in consideration of the
 sum of One Dollar to me in hand
 paid by John Boney of the County and State aforesaid do
 hereby give grant bargain sell and deliver unto the said John
 Boney the following property to-wit a Negro woman named Edy
 about thirty four years of age a boy named Frank about ten
 years of age a girl named Rhos about eight years old
 a boy named Ark about six years old a boy named Edward
 about three years old a boy named Abram about one year old
 also my three horses the head of cattle twenty head of Hogs
 twenty head of sheep six beds and bedsteads and bed furniture
 one Bureau one Table one metal clock one set of black Smith
 Tools one Wood Wagon and Warrup one Parawalk one Spring Wagon
 and Harrow one Rifle Gun one Spinning Machine one set of Sewing
 Machine together with all my personal articles of every kind to
 have and to hold the above property to the said John Boney his
 heirs and assigns provided nevertheless in trust
 to and for the use and purpose hereafter specified and set
 forth that is to say in trust to and for the use and
 benefit and behoof of my said wife Amy Mauney
 and as her separate free from the control or interference of me
 the said Michael or any of the future husbands of the said
 Amy Mauney unto the full power to dispose of the same
 by deed or will by and with the advice and concurrence of
 her said trustee the said John Boney provided nevertheless
 further that the above conveyance in trust for my said wife
 shall not in any wise operate to hinder or delay any creditor
 to whom I am now indebted from the collection of his demands
 against me in any manner provided out by law as the
 above described property is liable to the payment of all debts
 which I now owe at the making and delivering of these presents
 truthly and properly even the witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this 23^d day of January 1846

Amey Mauney Bill of Sale to Mary Ann Mauney
 The State of Texas, County of Hopkins, I, Amey Mauney of the County and State aforesaid for
 and in consideration of the sum of two thousand Dollars to me
 in hand paid by Mary Ann Mauney of the same State and
 County have this day bargained and sold unto the said Mary
 Ann Mauney three Negro Slaves for life viz, one a Negro boy
 about twenty two years old of yellow complexion by the name
 of Franklin one a boy about eight years old of dark complexion
 by the name of David and one a woman of yellow complexion
 about forty years of age by the name of Emily all of which
 Negro Slaves I bind myself my heirs Executors Administrators or
 legal representatives to forever warrant and defend the title unto
 unto the said Mary Ann Mauney her heirs assigns or legal
 representatives given under my hand and seal hereunto for
 Seal this 11th day of March 1836 Amey Mauney

The State of Texas, Before me the undersigned authority
 County of Hopkins, personally came Amey Mauney to
 me known and whose name appears to the foregoing Bill of
 Sale of three Negro Slaves to Mary Ann Mauney dated 11th
 March 1836 and acknowledged that she signed said and
