Know all men by these presents that I Sarah Elizabeth Crook of the County of Hopkins and State of Texas for & in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas B. Clark of said County the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have this day bargained sold and delivered & conveyed unto the said Thomas B. Clark and his heirs and assigns forever one Negro man Charles aged about 26 years a Slave for life and a half year and the said Slave to be named in body & in mind & Slave for life witness my hand & Seal this 12<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1857
