Beasley of the County of Hopkins do hereby convey and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to us paid by James F. Curran of said County and State Texas this day bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and convey to the said James F. Curran and his heirs persons some certain lots situated in the town of Sulphur Springs in said County within lots situated in the town of Sulphur Springs in said County on the east side of said town on the N. E. 1/4 each being thirty feet wide and thirty feet in width both sides north and thirty feet wide and thirty feet in width both sides south forming a block seventy feet wide and one hundred and twenty feet long beginning thirty feet and a half feet east of the east side of the public square in said town and thirty feet south of the south side of the block running east from each east corner of said square and said land one hundred and twenty feet long and thirty feet wide. These lands being the same that we granted and conveyed to the said James F. Curran and his heirs. To have and to hold the said premises and every part thereof to the said James F. Curran and his heirs and assigns forever. And we the said John F. Beasley and A. B.
